

King of the Mountain at P.C.B.F. Rules \$10.00

The King of the Mountain course is Course 8 on the map on the back of your schedule. The first target is a deer and the last target is a ground hog. There is twenty-six total targets. Traditional shooters will shoot from the orange stake. Hunter class will shoot from the blue stake. Pro class will shoot from the red stake.

Pro Class – All shooters qualify for this class. Shooters may not use range finders. Besides that anything goes. This class is for the best of the best.

Hunter Class – Fixed pins must be used, cross hairs or circle style pins without lens or magnification. If circle style pins are used, all circles must be the same size. Sights may not be adjusted after entering the course. Stabilizers may not be more than 12 inches long.

Traditional Class – Longbows, recurves, flat-bows, self-bows, are allowed in this class. Take downs are allowed. Any arrow material may be used. No sights or pins may be used. No elevated rest. All arrows must be shot from the shelf.

Misc. Rules and scoring

Shooting Stakes – Pro class will shoot from the Red stake. Hunter class will shoot from the Blue stake. Traditional class will shoot from the orange stake. Shooters must touch the stake with their front foot.

Scoring – Scoring will be 10 for the center circle, 8 for the remainder of the kill, and a (-5) for any other part of the animal hit. Some targets have a very small circle that is usually counted as a twelve. A hit in this area will count as a 10. In the case of a pass through, if you and another person in your group can agree on what the score should be, write that score in. This does not count if an arrow goes through the very edge of any animal. Remember any normal five in this shoot will be considered a -5.

Competition and awards – To make it to the finals a shooter must score in the top four of any given class. If a tie occurs we will use the total score of five targets which we feel are some of the more challenging targets. If a tie is still present we will count the number of tens. Any ties after that will be settled by a sudden death shoot off. The top three in each category will get cash prizes. First place gets 50%, Second place gets 30%, and Third place gets 20%. All money goes back to winners.

*If you are in the top four of any given class we will meet Sunday Morning at 9:00am to have a shootout on the west side of the lodge. We will put out three to four targets at varying ranges and the best scores will win. Money goes back to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners.
